I am immensely proud to share our Impact Report for 2023-24. Our dedicated staff, volunteers and trustees have worked tirelessly throughout the year, resulting in remarkable outcomes and achievements. Strategically, as a team we reviewed and agreed our new vision "Building better lives through volunteering".

This year, Volunteer Centre Sutton staff and volunteers supported a total of 8,888 clients and participants across all our projects. To further extend our reach and impact, we have expanded into new areas of work through our Community Support team. In total, across adult, community and youth services, we have 705 active volunteers who contributed an astounding 35,808 hours of service.

Across Sutton, we have nearly 4,000 people registered with us to find local volunteering opprtunties. Whether someone is volunteering with one of our own projects or with one (or more!) of the 750 organisations we work with, together we are building better lives through volunteering.

I extend my deepest thanks to everyone who has contributed to these achievements, and I look forward to continuing our journey of making a difference together.

Supporting Organisations Working With Volunteers

At the heart of our work as a Volunteer Centre, we provide a dedicated service to any organisation working with volunteers, advising them on all aspects of volunteer recruitment, retention, management and best practice.

Supporting Communities

We run several projects designed to welcome and support newly arrived residents in Sutton, including Integrating Sutton (funded by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities), and the Ukraine and Afghan community (both funded by Sutton Council).

Ukraine Support

Over 250 Ukrainians supported

45 sessions of the Saturday morning Ukraine Children's Cultural Group (ages 5-12) with an average weekly attendance of **50 children**

100 children and young people supported via the Ukraine Children's Cultural Group, holiday club and teenagers' social club



80 sessions providing group "counselling" support for adults with an average attendance of **15** adults

69 sessions providing wellbeing activities for adults, from art and craft, choir, yoga and walking groups



Health Navigators

Our Health Navigators conduct free health and wellbeing checks for residents and ensure that everyone has access to vital health information. This project is run in partnership with NHS South West London Integrated Care System.



Reisdents can come along to a session and have various health checks done including BMI and blood pressure. Our Health Navigators also share information about healthcare services and using the NHS app.






Benefits Form Filling

Launched in July 2023, our Benefits Form Filling project runs in partnership with Together for Sutton.

Residents are referred to us to meet with a trained volunteer, to help them complete vital benefits forms to access financial support.

Community Volunteer Squad

Launched in June 2023, the Community Volunteer Squad is a project that connects local volunteers with residents in need to perform basic, one-off 'helpful tasks'. All residents' referrals come via agencies including the Together for Sutton partnership, Home-Start Sutton and Sutton Women's Centre.

Sutton Emergency Response Volunteers

The Sutton Emergency Response Volunteers are a group of residents who have undergone training to equip them with the skills to provide vital support during major incidents. Once trained, residents are added to a call-up register, ready to be mobilised when our borough faces a major emergency.

Sutton Befrienders

Sutton Befrienders

Sutton Befrienders aims to reduce social isolation and loneliness for people living in the London Borough of Sutton. As well as providing one-to-one support, we run a wide range of groups and activities.

121 Befriending Volunteers supported 325 clients

99 isolated adults with care needs received over 9,000 hours of support, with weekly face to face home visits

83% of clients report being involved with Sutton Befrienders has made them feel more socially connected

98% of Clients and Volunteers feel being involved with Sutton Befrienders has had a positive impact on them

MAPS Mentoring

MAPS Mentoring is an award-winning programme supporting children and young people to achieve their full potential through the support of a one-to-one volunteer adult role model.

people supported through weekly one-to-one
Mentoring which equates to 14,880 hours



2023-2024 Cohort:

- 56% had a parent with mental health issues

Maps Advocacy Mentoring, Advocacy

Advocacy is about supporting people to have their voices heard. For MAPS Advocacy this means empowering children and young people who are Children in Care, Care Leavers or children involved in child protection proceedings.



The MAPS Advocacy service is a delivery partner of Together for Sutton and Advocacy for All.



166 children and young people received individual Advocacy to support them to have their voices heard

Sam, a care experienced 17 year-old, was **facing homelessness**, having spent a while sofa surfing at friends' houses. She had been declined Care Leaver's support by the local authority.

With the support of her Advocate, Sam was able to secure a Care Leaver's support package, providing Sam with a secure home and a personal advisor to support with taking the next steps into early adulthood.



Family Hubs

The aim of Family Hubs is to provide earlier and more joined up support for children, young people and families.

Volunteering is one of the four key parts to the Family Hub model, and Volunteer Centre Sutton is part of a partnership developing Family Hubs for Sutton, as part of Sutton Council's "Helping Early" strategy.

Volunteer Centre Sutton devised and delivered training to Family Hub staff to enable them to recruit, train and retain parent volunteers:

1 parent/carer representative attending the Children's Delivery Board and Family Hub partnership meetings

Youth Participation and Engagement

We are working to develop and deliver a youth participation and engagement strategy for the London Borough of Sutton.

Through this work, children and young people have created their own delivery plan, focussing on 3 key areas of concern:mental health, safety and inequality.

- Presented to Sutton Neighbourhood Watch
- Helped run our stall at the Carshalton **EcoFair**
- Visited the Mayor of Sutton's parlour
- Taking part in the Jack Petchey **Achievement Award Scheme**
